GIANNA JESSEN

Gianna Jessen's story is truly remarkable - she survived an abortion. Her courage and dignity have proven inspirational on previous YD college tours and it is our pleasure to welcome her back to Ireland to a new generation of pro-life activists.

Surviving a saline abortion at seven months gestation left Gianna with cerebral palsy, but she lives her life to the full and recently ran a marathon.

She has spoken before the US Congress and the British House of Commons. Gianna's powerful testimony puts a human face to the abortion debate, and reminds us that in every abortion a human being's life is ended.



LILA ROSE

When Lila Rose was 15, she founded Live Action films as a means to reach her peers with the pro-life message. She wanted to to expose the hypocrisies and lies of the pro-abortion movement, and has been incredibly successful at doing so. Lila has attracted international media coverage with her undercover investigations which exposed racism and statutory rape coverups at Planned Parenthood.

Her most recent venture, "The Mona Lisa Project", has prompted officials in several states to take action against Planned Parenthood - the world's largest abortion providers, who are undergoing investigations and seeing cuts in funding as a result.



DR TONY LEVATINO

Dr. Anthony Levatino has practiced obstetrics and gynaecology since 1980. He became infamous in the Albany area when he was one of the only abortionists providing late-term abortions.

Dr. Levatino eventually quit the abortion industry after a life-altering event caused him to realise that every life is precious gift. He is now a well-known pro-life advocate, and gives a remarkable insight into the callous mindset of the abortion industry.



BERNADETTE SMYTH

Bernadette is the founder of Precious Life in the North of Ireland. She has brought fresh energy and

new ideas to pro-life campaigning. Bernadette was instrumental in the establishment of the All Party Pro-Life Committee in Stormont which voted unanimously not to allow the legislation of abortion in the North of Ireland.



JOHN PRIDMOR

John Pridmore spent much of his life involved in organised crime, and was in and out of prisons since

he was 15. At a pivotal time in his life, John realised something was missing, and resolved to turn his life around. His dramatic conversion has inspired countless young people to change their lives. He now dedicates his time speaking to young people, encouraging them to embrace a culture of Life.



RRYAN KEMPER

Bryan is the founder of Stand True Ministries, and he utilises music and a variety of internet-based

resources to reach young people with the pro-life message. His success and charisma have motivated young people to actively take up the pro-life cause in the U.S and beyond.

Most of all, we believe that Ireland should be kept abortion-free. One person can make a difference, and that person can be you.










MAP OF MAYNOOTH VILLAGE



- *Maynooth is served by two bus routes the 66 and the 67a. These buses depart from Pearse St. in Dublin city centre and run a frequent service to Maynooth which costs €2.10 each way. There are also 66x and 67x express services to and from Maynooth which run a several times a day.
- *Maynooth lies on the Western Suburban railway line which serves three city centre stations
- Pearse Station, Tara St. and Connolly Station as well as nine other suburban stations -Drum-condra, Broombridge, Ashtown, Phoenix Park, Castleknock, Coolmine, Clonsilla, Leixlip Confey and Leixlip Louisa Bridge. Trains to and from Longford and Sligo also stop at Maynooth.

REMEMBER BABY C

This year, a rape victim who had been brought to England by the HSE to have an abortion spoke out on RTÉ. She revealed that she had never wanted the abortion; that social workers had arranged it without her full knowledge or consent, and that 12 years later, she still grieves for her aborted child. Just 13 when she became pregnant following a brutal assault, she was taken for the abortion against her parents' wishes. The HSE social workers who brought her to England, had sworn in court that the young girl had said she would kill herself if she was denied an abortion. It's now clear that the HSE lied, and that this girl and her baby were being abused to further the agenda of abortion supporters.

On November 22nd, we remember her baby, who she has now named Shannon, and stand in solidarity with this young woman, known as Miss C, whose courage has revealed the appalling behaviour of abortion campaigners. We call for a public inquiry into the behaviour and agenda of the HSE who continue to bring young girls in care for abortions. We hope that you will join us on Sunday to remember Baby C and all victims of abortion.
